Labour Force Survey Principal Results 2002 Acceding Countries

The spring 2002 Labour Force Survey provides the following estimates for the 66.7 million people living in private households in the 10 Acceding Countries (ACC): Czech Republic, Estonia, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Hungary, Malta, Poland, Slovenia, Slovak Republic.

- 28.9 million had a job during the reference week of the survey:
 - 56.1% of the population aged 15-64 was employed, compared to 64.2% in the EU. The employment rate was highest in Cyprus (68.5%), the Czech Republic (65.6%) and Slovenia (64.3%). It was as low as 51.7% in Poland. The employment rate was on average 11.6 percentage points higher for males (61.9% at ACC level compared to 50.3% for females). The difference reached more than 16 percentage points in Cyprus (19.9), the Czech Republic (16.8) and Malta (41.4).
 - 7.8% of employed persons worked part-time compared to 18.2% in the EU. Part-time employment represented 10.3% of total female employment (from 2.7% in the Slovak Republic to 18.9% in Malta).
 - 22.8 million workers were employees (79.0% of total employment, 84.4% in the EU) and 11.1% of them (13.1% in the EU) had a contract with limited duration (less than 3% in Estonia, more than 14% in Poland and Slovenia).
 - The average usual working hours were 41.4 hours a week for full-time employees and 23.2 hours for part-time employees (from 39.5 hours for full-time employees in Lithuania to 43.6 hours in Latvia). In the EU, the results were respectively 40.0 and 19.7 hours.
- 5.0 million people were unemployed, which represented 14.8% of the overall ACC labour force (15.3% for females). The EU rate was 7.6%.
 - Long term unemployment (one year and more) represented 54.3% of unemployment as a whole (compared to 40.2% in the EU): it was more than 65% in the Slovak Republic.
 - 31.6% of the labour force aged 15-24 years old was unemployed (compared to 12.6% for the age class 25-64) which represented 11.9% of the total population of the same age (6.9% in the EU).
- 26.6 million people aged 15 years and more were inactive.

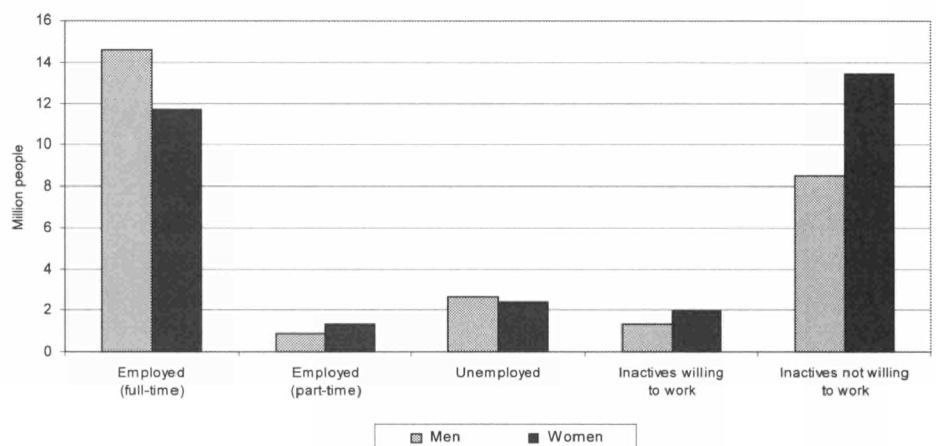
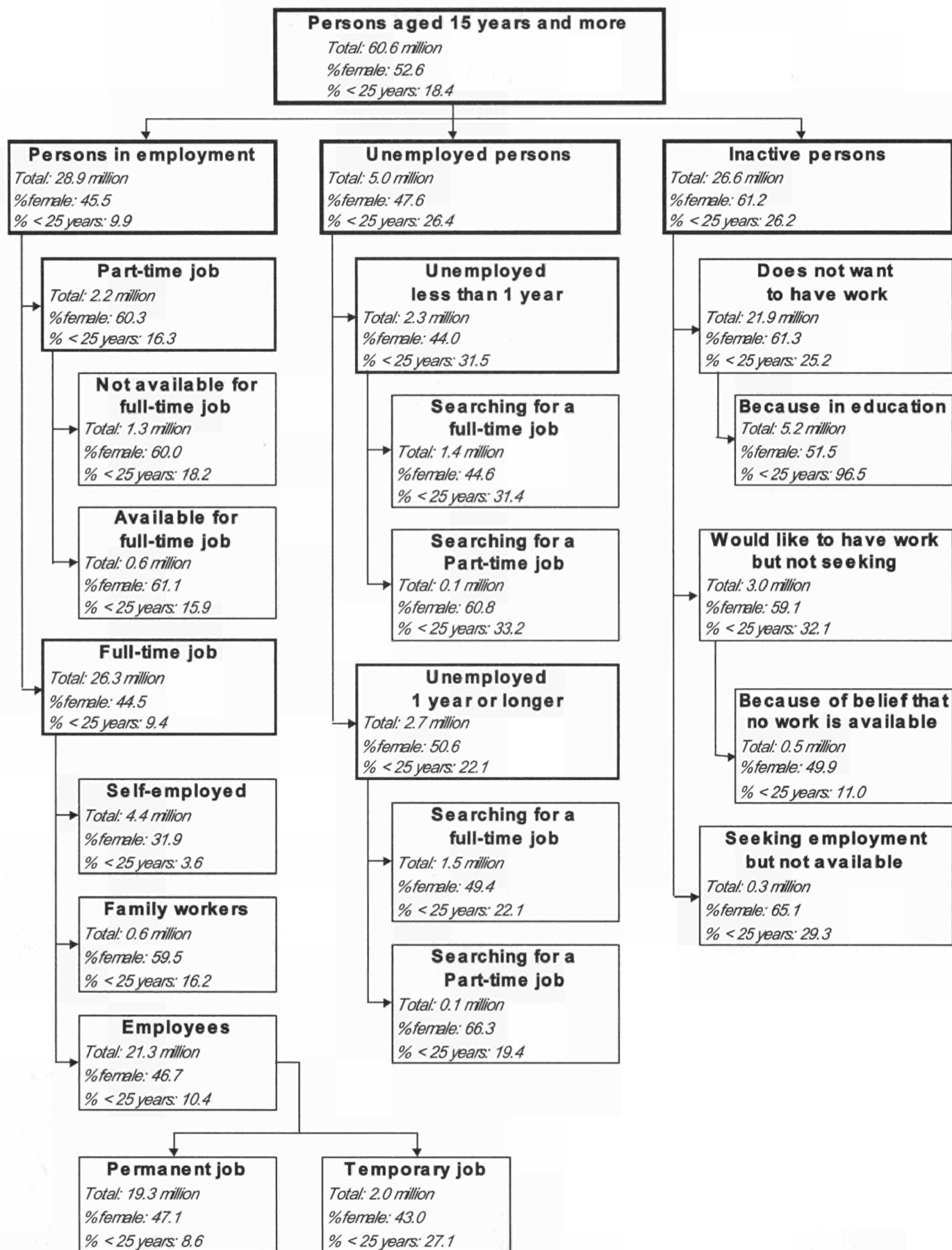


Figure 1: Population by sex and activity status, ACC, 2002

➤ EXPLANATORY NOTES

The European Labour Force Survey was conducted in spring 2002 in accordance with Council Regulation (EEC) No. 577/98 of 9 March 1998. Twelve Candidate countries also participated in the survey. Comparable data are not yet available for Turkey.

A detailed description of the sampling methods, the adjustment procedures, the definitions and the common EU coding currently used in the labour force survey is presented in the publication *Labour Force Survey – Methods and definitions, 2001* and *Labour Force Survey in central and east European countries – Methods and definitions, 2000*.

Basic concepts and definitions

All these definitions apply to persons aged 15 years and over, living in private households. The concepts and definitions used in the survey follow the guidelines of the International Labour Organisation. Persons carrying out obligatory military service are not included.

Employed persons were those who during the reference week did any work for pay or profit for at least one hour, or were not working but had jobs from which they were temporarily absent. Family workers are included.

Unemployed persons comprise persons aged 15 to 74 who were without work during the reference week, were currently available for work and were actively seeking work or who found a job to start later.

Duration of unemployment is defined as:

- (a) the duration of search for a job, or
- (b) the length of the period since the last job was held (if this period is shorter than the duration of search for a job).

The **active population** (labour force) is defined as the sum of employed and unemployed persons.

Inactive persons are those who are neither classified as employed nor as unemployed.

Employees are defined as persons who work for a public or private employer and who receive compensation in the form of wages, salaries, payment by results or payment in kind; non-conscript members of the armed forces are also included

The **number of usual hours worked per week** corresponds to the number of hours the person normally work including extra hours, either paid or unpaid, which the person normally works, but excludes the travel time between the home and the place of work as well as the main meal breaks.

Employment rates represent employed persons as a percentage of the same age population.

Unemployment rates represent unemployed persons as a percentage of the active population.

Youth unemployment ratio represents unemployed aged less than 25 years as a percentage of the population of this age group.

Population in education includes persons who had followed any kind of education during the 4 weeks preceding the week of reference. Students who were on holidays in this period are not included.

Early school leavers includes all the persons aged 18 to 24 who are not in education/training and with at most lower secondary education (ISCED 0-2).

All rates and ratios are calculated excluding non responses.
