ITEMS DEBATED

PREPARATION OF EU-RUSSIA SUMMIT

The Council was briefed by the Presidency, the Commission and High Representative Javier Solana on preparation for the EU-Russia Summit to be held in The Hague on 11 November, and held an exchange of views.

The summit, the fourteenth to be held under the EU–Russia Partnership and Co-operation Agreement, is due to address the building of four "common spaces" to the EU and Russia, namely the common economic space, the common space of freedom, security and justice, the common space of external security and the common space of research and education. International and regional issues, such as the Middle East (including Iran and Iraq), terrorism, Moldova and the South Caucasus, are also likely to be discussed. The Presidency noted that the four "spaces" were part of a single package.

The summit will be hosted by the President of the European Council, Netherlands Prime Minister Jan Balkenende, assisted by Mr Solana and the President of the Commission as well as Netherlands Foreign Minister Bernhard Bot. Russia will be represented by President Vladimir Putin, accompanied by Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov.

- Iraq - Council conclusions

OTHER BUSINESS

– Somalia

The Council held a brief exchange of views on the situation in Somalia following the election of Mr Abdullahi Yusuf as President on 10 October and the expected formation of a transitional government, on the basis of briefings by the Italian delegation, High Representative Mr Javier Solana and the Swedish delegation.

Delegations reiterated support for the peace process in Somalia and emphasised the EU's willingness to contribute to the country's stabilisation and reconstruction, notably through support for African Union initiatives.

– African Great Lakes Region

The Council was briefed by the Belgian Minister on efforts to bring peace and security to the African Great Lakes region, with particular focus on the Democratic Republic of Congo, in the light of his recent mission in the region.

– Guinea -Bissau

The Council was briefed by the Portuguese Minister on recent developments in Guinea-Bissau following unrest on 6 October and on efforts led by the international community, including Portuguese-speaking States, with a view to contributing to a stabilisation of the situation.

– Belarus

At Poland's suggestion, the Council discussed EU policy with regard to Belarus in the light of irregularities in the parliamentary elections and referendum on 17 October and attacks on opposition leaders and media representatives at a political demonstration in Minsk on 19 October.

It will discuss the matter in greater detail at its meeting on 22 November.
