INTRODUCTION

Article 29 of the Financial Regulation of 21 December 1977, applicable to the General Budget, reads as follows:

"The Commission shall, four times a year, present the European Parliament and the Council with a report on the Communities' financial situation, including both revenue and expenditure. There shall be attached to these reports a comprehensive statement on the sums maintained from previous financial years, as well as on any changes brought about as a result of the adoption of Supplementary or Amending Budgets".

This report, drawn up on the basis of the financial situation at 31 December 1980 (taking account of payments made up to 15 January 1981), shows the main features of the implementation of the budget in 1980.

The figures shown are provisional. The final figures will appear in the analysis of financial management which the Commission will be submitting to the budgetary authority pursuant to Article 75 of the Financial Regulation.

REVENUE

REVENUE

1. The following table shows the revenue situation at 31 December 1980, together with the amounts of revenue expressed as a percentage of the estimates in the 1980 Budget as adjusted by Supplementary and Amending Budget No 1 adopted on 20 November 1980 (adjustments to estimates of customs duties and agricultural levies) and Supplementary Budget No 2 adopted on 23 December 1980 (increase in the VAT rate and hence in own resources accruing from VAT to cover additional expenditure on emergency aid to Italy and on the Social Fund).

For all revenue, the outturn was 98,09% of the estimate. The absolute figure was 15.873,7 m EUA, i.e. 308,8 m EUA less than the estimated amount.

2. For total own resources (customs duties, agricultural levies, sugar and isoglucose levies, VAT), which represented 94,43% of total revenue entered in the Budget (including Supplementary and Amending Budgets Nos 1 and 2), actual revenue was 98,17% of the estimate.

Customs duties, which, as in the past, tended to rise in the second and third quarters, fell sharply in the fourth quarter. The amounts were 4% down on the third quarter, whereas in previous years the fall had been around 1%. This meant that the fourth quarter provided only 24,9% of the total for the year as against 26,7% in 1979 and 25,8% in 1978 (1).

Actual revenue from customs duties was 98,43% of the estimate.

Agricultural levies brought in 101,02% of the estimated amount. After falling in the second and third quarters, revenue from this source in the fourth quarter was high, 31% up on the previous quarter. This seasonal movement, which has also occurred in previous years, is clearly caused by the volume of imports; for while the levy rates for cereals in August, September and October were lower than the previous months levels, which were already down on those for the 1978/79 marketing year because of the firmness of world prices (for common wheat the rate was 10,5% lower than the average between November 1979 and July 1980 and for maize 21%), this drop was more than offset by the increase in the volume of imports, 17,9% more common wheat being imported from August to October 1980 than in the previous three months and 85,7% more maize.

The aggregate revenue from sugar levies was 93,32% of estimates. If isoglucose levies are included, the figure falls to 92,55%. There are two reasons for this:

(i) Belgium did not make its payment on account for the 1979/80 marketing year as it was unable to collect from Amylum, which contested the validity of Council Regulation (EEC) No 1293/79 of 25 June 1979

amending Regulation (EEC) No 1111/77 laying down common provisions for isoglucose (1) and argued that the Regulation was the subject of an action before the Court of Justice;

(ii) acting on the ruling of the Court of 25 October 1978, the Commission last year completed the refund of levies paid in respect of the 1977/78 marketing year. The isoglucose accounts therefore show a negative balance of 2,65 m EUA, which represents the difference between refunds made by the Commission and the payments made by Member States for 1979/80.

In its judgments of 29 October 1980 the Court of Justice declared Regulation No 1293/79 void for a formal defect (infringement of an essential procedural requirement) on the grounds that the opinion of Parliament required by Article 43 of the EEC Treaty had not been delivered, although the Court rejected the complaints as to the substance of the Regulation made by the applicants, Roquette and Mafzena.

The Commission has therefore proposed that the provisions of the Regulation be re-enacted, with retroactive effect to 1 July 1979, and at the same time has confirmed that the scheme will be extended for the 1980/81 sugar year. Pending adoption of this Regulation by the Council - after it has obtained Parliament's opinion - the Commission has not refunded the payments already received and has suspended Member States' liability for amounts not yet collected.

VAT resources totalled 97,76% of estimates. The shortfall arises from the fact that three Member States - Belgium, Germany and France - are contesting the legality of Supplementary Budget No 2 and accordingly adjusted their payments for 1980 not on the basis of the amounts entered in the supplementary budget adopted on 23 December 1980, as the Commission had requested, but on the basis of the draft established by the Council on 12 December. The infringement procedure under Article 169/EEC was initiated by letters sent on 13 February 1981.

- 3. The ECSC paid over, in four quarterly instalments, the 5 m EUA due as its contribution to administrative expenditure.
- 4. Deductions from staff remuneration and miscellaneous revenue produced 58,2% and 151% respectively of the estimated amounts. The low figure for deductions from remuneration was essentially due to the adjustment of the income tax scale following the Council's Decision of 21 January 1980. This adjustment led to a substantial reduction in basic salaries, used as a basis for calculating deductions, and hence to far less revenue than originally estimated.

The high percentage figure for miscellaneous revenue is largely accounted for by bank interest, which was much higher than estimated in the budget, by the repayment of certain Community aids and by the receipt of entitlements established in the previous financial year.

5. The financial contributions towards Euratom complementary programmes due from the two Member States concerned - Germany and the Netherlands - were paid in full: this total, following the Council Decision of 13 March 1980, being 12.843.000 EUA.

I. REVENUE

Total revenue at 31 Bacember 1980 amounted to 2.040.729,03 EUA, i.e. 67% of the estimated revenue allocated to the Court of Justice in the 1980 Budget (3.031.210 EUA).

It will be noted that revenue accruing from the tax on staff remuneration amounted to only 1.150.385,85 EUA, i.e. 49,8% of the estimate. It should be remembered that the application of the new rectified salary scales had a considerable effect on the yield of the tax.

II. EXPENDITURE

1. Appropriation available

The total appropriations allocated to the Court of Justice in the 1980 Budget were 21.707.280,00 EUA.

Carryovers from 1979 to 1980 totalled 1.247.549,02 EUA.

Transfers within chapters amounted to 680.800 EUA and transfers between chapters to 195.000 EUA in 1980.

2. Utilization of appropriations for 1980

1980 appropriations committed totalled 19.330.830,30 EUA, representing a rate of utilization of 89,1%.

Payments made totalled 18.091.724,80 EUA.

Appropriations remaining unused at 31 December 1980 will be carried over automatically to 1981.

Payments from all appropriations carried over automatically, i.e. 1.247.549,02 EUA, amounted to 1.220.433,96 EUA - a utilization rate of 97,8%.

ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COMMITTEE

The application of the provisional twelfths arrangements held back expenditure in the Economic and Social Committee during the 1980 financial year. However, over 94% of the appropriations available were used.

The rate of utilization under Title 1 was normal, except in Chapter 14 where the budgetary restrictions during the first half of the year reduced expenditure.

In Title 2 an exceptionally large volume of appropriations have been committed but not yet paid, most being connected with the building and equipping of new meeting rooms in preparation for the accession of the new Member States.

Amounts committed under Chapters 20, 22 and 26 total more than 1.500.000 EUA.

SUMMARY OF ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENDITURE BY THE COURT IN 1980

I. INTRODUCTION

This summary has been drawn up in pursuance of Article 29 of the Financial Regulation of 21 December 1977. The figures are still provisional and may be amended when it has been determined what uncommitted appropriations lapse.

The analysis of the financial management provided for in Article 75 of the Financial Regulation will be drawn up at the same time as the balance sheet and revenue and expenditure account of the Court and will replace this summary.

II. REVENUE

Total revenue at 31 December 1980 was 63% of the Court of Auditors own revenue, as estimated in the 1980 Budget (1.917.320 EUA).

The Community tax and staff contributions to the financing of the pension scheme yielded 45,95% and 83,03% respectively of the estimates for the year.

The low percentage obtained from the tax can be explained by the Council's decision to amend the basic salary tables after the revenue estimates had been drawn up.

III. EXPENDITURE

1. Appropriations available

The 1980 Budget includes a total appropriation of 13.039.290 EUA for the Court of Auditors.

A total of 636.595,88 EUA was carried over from 1979 to 1980.

A total of 571.280 EUA was transferred within chapters and a total of 65.600 between chapters.

2. Utilization of the appropriations for 1980

The table attached records the implementation of expenditure by title and chapter.

Title 1

In 1980 84,34% of the final budget estimates for Title 1 were used.

The reason for the gap between estimates and actual expenditure under Title 1 was that the entry into service of newly recruited staff was spread over a period of time, the recruitment procedures for posts provided for under the 1980 Budget not beginning until the Budget had been adopted.

Title 2

In commitments the rate of utilization was normal, except for Chapter 23. This was taken into account in the establishment of the budget estimates for 1981, where appropriate adjustments were made.

Appropriations carried over from 1979

Payments from the 636.595,88 EUA carried over amounted to 561.382,93 EUA, a level of utilization of 88,19%.

PRELIMINARY REMARKS

I. Application of the provisional twelfths system

Following the rejection by Parliament of the 1980 draft budget, the Community institutions automatically began operating the system of provisional twelfths on 1 January 1981. By its very nature, this is an interim arrangement for dealing with a quite exceptional situation. It allows activities to continue but not to develop.

In operating the twelfths arrangements the institutions differed in their interpretation of the rules regarding which basis was to be used for calculating the twelfths. The Commission worked on the basis of the double limit laid down in the first paragraph of Article 204 of the EEC Treaty: expenditure, by chapter, may not exceed one twelfth of the appropriations entered in the previous budget or one twelfth of the appropriations "provided for in the draft budget in the course of preparation" for the financial year in question - "or, in the absence thereof, in the preliminary draft budget" pursuant to Article 8 of the Financial Regulation - whichever amount is the smaller.

Certain delegations in the Council and certain members of the Committee on Budgets disputed this interpretation, holding that the rejection of the budget by Parliament rescinded all acts under the budgetary procedure for 1980 and that, in consequence, pending the new preliminary draft that the Commission had to prepare, the limit to apply had to be the appropriations authorized for 1979.

There were similar differences of opinion about whether or not it was possible, under the twelfths arrangements, to transfer appropriations between chapters.

In reply to the legal vacuum argument, the Commission has always adduced the need to ensure the continuity of the public service, taking the view that the legislator did not wish to hamper application of these arrangements by creating obstacles greater than those existing in the course of normal implementation.

As regards the implications for the implementation of appropriations, it should be pointed out that, for a number of sectors, the arrangements were a factor of uncertainty which, while they applied, acted as a brake on the implementation of planned measures. This was the case in particular for a series of appropriations which fall within Parliament's margin of manoeuvre.

Moreover, the new headings in the 1980 Budget contained no appropriations whatsoever until the budget was adopted, measures in these sectors being held up until then.

Despite all these difficulties, there was an appreciable improvement in the second half of the year, and as a result the final rate of utilization of differentiated appropriations for the year increased very substantially from 39,5% in 1979 to 68,8% at 31 December 1980 for payments and from 79,7% to 88,7% for commitments.

This improvement is particularly evident in the utilization of the payment appropriations of the three structural Funds: 100% in the case of the Social Fund, as against 32,2% in 1979 (not including the new appropriations entered by Parliament in Supplementary Budget No 2/1980); 97,9% as against 60,1% in the case of the Regional Fund, and 89% as against 48% in the case of the Guidance Section of the EAGGF.

In Title 3, however, the percentage of payments from the year's appropriations was slightly down on 1979 (47,87% as against 51,38%), although commitments were up (70% as against 65,29% in 1979). But this result relates to a much larger volume of appropriations (up by 32% for payments and 7% for commitments), and also the application of the provisional twelfths arrangements severely affected the utilization of indirect action research and investment appropriations, since a series of programmes passed at the end of 1979 were completely without appropriations until the budget was adopted.

Payments from Title 2 appropriations (Buildings, equipment and miscellaneous operating expenditure) were also affected by the belated adoption of the budget, in particular as regards Chapter 27 appropriations (Publishing and information), although the level of commitments was still 98,9%.

Finally, during the period concerned, the Commission requested additional twelfths only when absolutely necessary. The budgetary authority was asked to approve additional twelfths only for Chapters 21 (Rents), 59 (Aid to disaster victims) and 95 (Specific measures to assist developing countries and other non-member countries). It also became clear that the appropriations available under the provisional twelfths system for the EAGGF Guarantee Section would be insufficient after June. A proposal for the provision of additional twelfths, which the budgetary authority accepted, became unnecessary, however, following the adoption of the budget on 9 July 1980.

The above table shows that the level of commitments was very satisfactory for appropriations under almost all headings. The less satisfactory level of payments can to some extent — in the case of new headings — be attributed to the fact that no appropriations were available while the provisional twelfths arrangements were in operation. For several of the headings carrying differentiated appropriations, where the rate of utilization is unsatisfactory, the Commission has reviewed the 1981 estimates very carefully. Where appropriations are not differentiated, the very high level of commitments ensures that virtually all the appropriations will be utilized. Detailed comments are given in the analysis of the utilization of appropriations by title and chapter.

Supplementary and Amending Budget No 1 for 1980, adopted on 20 November 1980, adjusted the amounts of VAT own resources after the six Member States concerned had sent in the final statements of their VAT bases for 1979 and revised the estimates of own resources for 1980 accruing from customs duties and agricultural levies in line with economic developments; advances on the supplementary measures for the United Kingdom were financed out of these additional resources.

Supplementary Budget No 2 for 1980, adopted on 23 December 1980, was to cover exceptional emergency aid to the victims of the Italian earthquake and payment appropriations for the Social Fund.

Chapter 100 appropriations (Provisional appropriations) were transferred in their entirety, both for commitments and for payments, with 22,46 m EUA in commitments and 16,26 m EUA in payments being incorporated in the transfer to Article 580.

3. Summary of the utilization of appropriations in 1980

3.1 <u>Implementation of 1980 appropriations (1)</u>

3.1.1 Non-differentiated appropriations

For non-differentiated appropriations the level of utilization was 99,7% in commitments and 97,7% in payments.

Differentiated appropriations

The utilization rate for differentiated appropriations improved appreciably: 88,7% for commitments (1979: 79,7%) and 68,8% for payments (1979: 39,7%).

The following chapter-by-chapter analysis gives the principal explanations of individual utilization rates. It should be borne in mind that commitment appropriations not committed at the end of a financial year automatically remain available for the following financial year; however, Chapter 33 appropriations (Expenditure on research and investment) remain available until cancelled under the budgetary procedure (Article 88(3) of the Financial Regulation).

Payment appropriations not utilized are automatically carried over to the following financial year.

3.2 Implementation of appropriations carried over from 1979 (1)

3.2.1 Automatic carryovers

Non-differentiated appropriations

The overall utilization rate for non-differentiated appropriations carried over (1) (appropriations committed but not yet paid) was 97,67%. This does not include the EAGGF Guidance Section appropriations from financial years prior to 1977 remaining due by virtue of commitments entered into, which may be automatically carried over for at least five years (2), and Chapter 58 appropriations (Aid for disaster victims in Friuli), which may be carried similarly (3). The utilization rates for these two items remain low (28,17% and 22,72% respectively). Automatic carryovers of appropriations remaining available amount to 17,41 m EUA (Friuli) and 192,327 m EUA (EAGGF Guidance).

Differentiated appropriations

The rate of utilization for unused payment appropriations, which were carried over automatically, was 90,77%. The percentage was 100% for the Social and Regional Funds, 96,40% for Title 3 appropriations (Energy, research, transport, etc.), 90,97% for the EAGGF Guidance Section and 48,39% for Title 9 (Development aid).

3.2.2 Non-automatic carryovers (4)

The rate of utilization of non-automatic carryovers (non-differentiated appropriations not committed at the end of 1979 for which authorization to carry over was given) was 100% for Titles 3, 5 and 9. Under Title 2, 15.000 EUA lapsed out of the 80.000 EUA carried over. The balance of EACGF Guidance Section appropriations carried over from financial years prior to 1977 which had again to be carried over was 116,40 m EUA, 51,20 m EUA having been paid during 1980.

The very high rate of utilization of Title 1 appropriations (99,83% committed and 97,97% paid) includes transfers approved by the budgetary authority to:

- Article 992 Commission delegations in the ACP countries and OCT (8 m EUA)
- Chapter 58 Supplementary measures to assist the United Kingdom (some 30 m EUA).

The transfer of appropriations out of Title 1 was possible mainly because:

- basic salaries were cut appreciably by the Council's decision on the adjustment of the scales (Regulation EEC/Euratom/ECSC No 160/80 of 21 January 1980 (1)), while the required appropriations had been estimated on the basis of salary levels before the adjustment. This left quite substantial amounts available;

- the increases in salaries and pensions of officials and other servants of the Communities that the Council actually awarded in 1980 were less than the estimates incorporated into the authorized appropriations;
- the Council's decision on the annual review of salaries and pensions for 1980 was not taken until 20 January 1981 with effect from 1 July 1980. This means that arrears for July-December 1980 must be paid from the 1981 Budget, thus leaving a further surplus in the 1980 appropriations.

The appropriations relating to commitments made within Title 1 which had not resulted in payments by 15 January have been carried over automatically.

Summary of utilization

Generally speaking, the late adoption of the budget had quite an appreciable effect on the payment of Title 2 appropriations. Though the commitment situation remains very satisfactory with a utilization rate of some 98,6%, only 76,6% of available appropriations were paid.

For the appropriations of Chapter 26 (Expenditure on studies, surveys and consultations) the appreciable gap which usually shows up between the percentage of payments and the percentage of commitments is quite normal in view of the procedure applying specifically for the management of study appropriations: programmes are approved in series in March, July and November and final contracts stipulate that payments will be staggered to match progress of the work.

The low rate of 60,76% for payments from Chapter 27 appropriations (Expenditure on publishing and information) can largely be explained by the fact that decisions on many information programmes could not be taken until the budget was adopted.

Special expenditure

To cover the cost of the monitoring and surveillance measures laid down in Commission Decision No 2794/80/ECSC of 31 October 1980 (1), establishing a system of steel production quotas for undertakings in the iron and steel industry, the Commission had to take some tough decisions within Chapter 26 (Expenditure on studies, surveys and consultations) in order to bolster Article 262 (Comprehensive Community studies and general surveys). An additional 1.896.000 EUA (141%) was found, 1 m EUA coming from a transfer between chapters which the Commission effected under Article 21(8) of the Financial Regulation. Of that amount 98% was committed by the end of the year. The remaining payments will be made during 1981.

Additional funds for Chapter 21 (Expenditure relating to the Data-processing Centre) (455.000 EUA) and Chapter 23 (Current operating expenditure) (39.000 EUA) were authorized by the budgetary authority.

Article 303 - Community measures to improve workers' housing conditions

Almost all (98%) the commitments appropriations were used; the percentage was much lower (49%) for payment appropriations, including the automatic carryovers from 1979, which amounted to 323.281 EUA. Since these were used first, the 1980 appropriations were not all used up. An amount of 543.515 EUA has thus been carried over to 1981.

Article 306 - Pilot research projects on action to combat poverty

There was no appropriation for commitment for 1980.

Of the 1,22 m EUA remaining from 1979, 740.000 EUA (61%) was committed to finance projects begun under the first anti-poverty programme (1975-79) and for follow-up work and assessments of this programme, which is nearing completion.

Of the 6,2 m EUA already committed, payments totalling 3,4 m EUA were made, 2,8 m EUA from appropriations for payment for 1980 and 620.000 EUA from payment appropriations automatically carried over (which were thereby fully used up).

The Council's decision of 27 November 1980 will enable certain studies to continue in order to round off the first programme.

Summary of utilization

At 31 December 1980, 99% of non-differentiated appropriations had been committed and 57% of the commitments entered into in 1980 and 1979 had been paid. The level of utilization of non-differentiated appropriations was thus higher for the whole of 1980 than for 1979. It should, however, be borne in mind that in 1980 for the first time there were differentiated appropriations for the expenditure under Article 313 (Farm Accountancy Data Network). All the commitment appropriations for this Article were used and none of the payment appropriations (since substantial carryovers were available).

1. Utilization of appropriations for 1980

(a) Non-differentiated appropriations

A total of 99% (8,1 m EUA) of the 1980 appropriations (8,2 m EUA) were used up.

This was the result of better management and of the transfers made in 1980, notably the one to Item 3112 (Veterinary inspection in non-member countries) to provide for an increase in inspection activities. A sum of 2,3 m EUA from Item 3102 (Community action in the event of outbreaks of epizootic disease) was included in the transfer to Article 580.

(b) Differentiated appropriations - Article 313 (Farm Accountancy Data Network - FADN)

As planned (see third quarterly report), the whole of the commitment appropriation available was committed in the last quarter of 1980. The entire appropriation for payment has been carried over automatically to the 1981 financial year. The appropriation entered in the 1980 Budget was originally intended for the settlement of commitments entered into before 1979 and still outstanding on 31 December of that year, when the changeover from non-differentiated appropriations to differentiated appropriations took place. But payments speeded up enormously in 1979 and all commitments entered into before 1979 had been settled by the end of that year. The first payments against commitments entered into in 1980 are scheduled for 1981. Allowance was made in the preparation of the 1981 Budget for the carryover of the appropriation for payment from 1980 to 1981.

2. Utilization of non-automatic carryover

As planned this appropriation (1 m EUA) was fully used up to assist Spain in the campaign against African swine fever (Item 3101).

3. Settlement of commitments entered into before 1980 (automatic carryovers)

At 31 December 1980, 84% (5,48 m EUA) of the commitments entered into and still outstanding on 1 January 1980 (6,53 m EUA) had been settled (1979 = 92%). The appropriations for the following headings were not fully utilized:

- (1) Item 3102 (Community action in the event of outbreaks of epizootic disease) (73%): The invoices submitted by the Member State concerned justified a payment of only 905.799 EUA (instead of the 1,25 m EUA committed in 1979).
- (2) Article 313 (Farm Accountancy Data Network) (68%): Payments are made in (n + 1) and (n + 2) because of the checks which have to be made on the results obtained. Implementation was better than seemed likely when the Preliminary Draft Budget for 1981 was being prepared.
- (3) Article 314 (Agricultural research) (87%): The reason was that some of the work provided for in contracts with research institutes was not done or has not been completed.

Utilization of <u>non-differentiated appropriations</u> (Articles 322, 327 and 328) was 99% for commitments and 36% for payments; the appropriations carried over from 1979 were used up entirely.

Article 322 - Transport of radioactive materials

The appropriations which Parliament entered under this heading were all committed.

Because of the delay in the conclusion of contracts with the recipients, the payments could not be made, and the appropriations will be carried over to 1981.

Article 327 - Energy balance sheets

Parliament gave this Article its first allocation with an appropriation of 350.000 EUA, to which was added some 300.000 EUA by a transfer from elsewhere in Chapter 32, bringing the total to 650.000 EUA.

Of this total 99% was committed and 13% paid. Because of the time required for signing the assistance contracts, these payments represent only the first instalments.

The balance has been carried over to 1981; the commitments entered into in 1980 are therefore covered.

Article 328 - Studies in the energy sector

The 300.000 EUA originally allocated by Parliament to this Article was increased by a transfer of 480.000 EUA from elsewhere in Chapter 32.

In commitments 98% of this appropriation was used; of the amounts available for payments, including 595.000 EUA carried over from 1979, 54% was used. The amounts committed but unpaid have been carried over to 198:.

Since the payment appropriations are used in accordance with the financial arrangements in contracts, some of them are carried over from one year to the next. All the appropriations carried over from 1979 were used up.

Article 320 - Projects in the hydrocarbons sector

Item 3200 - Community technological development projects

In 1980 this Item alone accounted for roughly 25% of commitment appropriations and 40% of payment appropriations in Chapter 32.

With a utilization rate of 96% in 1980 as against 78% in 1979, the increase in the support to the companies concerned can be considered very satisfactory.

Utilization of payment appropriations also improved appreciably, with 48% in 1980 as against 29% in 1979.

There are two reasons for these improvements:

(a) The operational appropriations of Chapter 32 were converted into differentiated appropriations only in 1977.

As a result of this change a relatively large volume of appropriations has had to be carried over from year to year, three to five years being required to absorb them completely; meantime priority is given to payments carried over from the previous year.

(b) The decision on the sixth series of projects was not taken until 27 October 1980 and though nearly all commitments were made before the end of 1980, the payments were slow. The leeway will be made up in 1981, as no new appropriation appears in the 1981 Budget.

Item 3201 - Joint projects in prospecting for hydrocarbons

As the Council has still not acted on the proposal for a basic Regulation, it was not possible to use the appropriations for commitment. To ensure that these appropriations (Chapter 100) did not lapse at the end of the year, the Commission requested that they be transferred to Item 3200 (Community technological development projects), where they were used to finance the sixth series of projects.

The payment appropriations (2,1 m EUA) have been carried over to 1981, since work on the Geological Survey of Greenland has not advanced sufficiently.

Item 3210 - Prospecting for uranium in Community territory

Following the conclusion of contracts fo uranium prospecting projects authorized by the Commission under Article 70 of the Euratom Treaty 86% of the appropriations were committed by 31 December; the balance has been carried over.

The rate of utilization of payment appropriations is still low since it covers only the 20% advance granted for the projects and a proportion of the sums due on earlier projects, in accordance with the work programme submitted by the recipient and with the financial arrangements in the contracts. All of the appropriations carried over from 1979 were used.

Article 324 - Aid to demonstration projects under the Community energy programme

Since the Council was late in adopting the implementing regulations, operations under Regulations Nos 1302/78 and 1303/78 (support for demonstration projects in the energy sector) were slightly behind schedule at the end of 1980. This will be made up in the early months of 1981.

Item 3240 - Community energy-saving programme

At 31 December 1980, 19.036.431 EUA remained unused under this heading. Commitments were 18.453.374 EUA, i.e. 49% of appropriations available, while 16% of the total payment appropriations were used.

These low percentages can be attributed to the cumbersome decision-making procedure for demonstration projects.

Since the Council decision on the second series of aids for financing 60 demonstration projects for a sum of 27 million EUA was not forthcoming until July, the Commission, despite all its effort, managed to conclude only some of the contracts, as negotiations with the recipients take several months.

Item 3241 - Programme for the development of new sources of energy

In 1980 this Item accounted for 40% of the commitment appropriations in Chapter 32. The 89% utilization rate for commitment appropriations as against 70% in 1979 is a fairly satisfactory improvement.

As the Council adopted the decision in November, 87% of the commitments were made in December (mainly for coal liquefaction and gasification and geothermal energy). The payments will follow during 1981.

In the Preliminary Draft Budget for 1981 the Commission substantially reduced its requests for payment appropriations, and these were confirmed by the budgetary authority.

Article 329 - Euratom loans

In accordance with the Council Decisions of 29 March 1977 (1) and 20 December 1979 (2), the Commission is authorized to contract loans, up to a maximum of 1.000 m EUA, to finance nuclear power stations.

The utilization of research and investment appropriations during the twelve months of 1980 was lower in percentage terms than in 1979, although the absolute amounts committed or paid were comparable or slightly higher.

Despite the belated approval of the Joint Research Centre's new programme for 1980-83 and the application of the provisional twelfths arrangements, virtually all the commitment appropriations for <u>direct action</u> were used. Payments, of course, were somewhat behind schedule, particularly for large-scale operations connected with the new nuclear safety programme (reactor safety and Super SARA project). These delays should easily be made up during 1981.

For indirect and concerted action appropriations the situation differed according to whether the operations were part of well-established programmes or programmes adopted at the end of 1979. The new operations suffered considerably from the application of the provisional twelfths arrangements, which left them without funds for the first six months of 1980 (environment and radioactive waste programmes). The pace of expenditure on the energy programme was slow because of the time taken by the procedures for examining and preparing contracts.

The rate of utilization of payment appropriations for <u>Community</u> participation in the JET undertaking was 91%. The rate for commitments does not reflect the real situation because of a change made in the accounting method in 1979, the effect of which will not wear off until 1981. From 1982 commitments and payments will be identical.

The utilization rates for the <u>differentiated appropriations</u> (Items 3620 and 3621) were 72% in appropriations for commitment and 69% in appropriations for payment; all the appropriations for payment carried over from 1979 were utilized.

The reasons for the relatively low utilization of payment appropriations are that the second three-year plan (1978-80) did not get under way until 1979 because the Council was late in adopting it and contracts have been spread over 1980 and 1981 in order to form a link with the third plan, which is currently being discussed by the Council.

The utilization rates for the <u>differentiated appropriations</u> (Items 3701, 3702, 3720, 3722 and 3750) were 87% for commitment appropriations and 76% for payment appropriations; the appropriations carried over from 1979 were utilized in full. Here too, the result is a marked improvement on 1979 (28% and 54% respectively).

Item 3701 - Second data-processing programme

This operation was completed in 1980. No new appropriations have been allocated for 1981. Appropriations still available for commitment and payment will be used in 1981.

Item 3702 - Community operations for the development of data processing

These operations had been held up because the data-processing programme was not adopted until 11 September 1979. But this delay was made up and only 4% (559.859 EUA) of the total appropriations for commitment have been carried over to 1981 - after allowance is made for a transfer of 400.000 EUA to Item 3703 (Community operations connected with the development of telematics).

Item 3720 - Operations in the ceramics sector and

Item 3722 - Textile industry technology

No action was taken on either of these programmes because the Council failed to take a decision. The Commission did, however, examine the possibility of spending the appropriations on one-off measures. It concluded that the remarks on the appropriations do not allow them to be used in this way and so they have been carried over automatically to 1981 (1,5 m EUA).

Item 3750 - Aid for certain crisis-hit industrial sectors

Since the Council has still not taken a decision on the Commission's proposal for a regulation, the Commission, in order to prevent the appropriations carried over from 1979 from lapsing, had to make two transfers within Chapter 37 (4,4 m EUA to Item 3702 and 0,8 m EUA to Item 379) and another to the supplementary measures to assist the United Kingdom.

Article 376 - Studies relating to industrial policy

All the appropriations were committed and payments will be made in accordance with the financial arrangements laid down in study contracts. All the appropriations carried over from 1979 were utilized.

These appropriations were committed in full in 1980, but payments were on the low side.

The education programme (Item 3920) is a special case in that contracts cover the academic year and advance payments of 60% are made, followed by additional payments from automatic carryovers. These carryovers are regularly utilized in full.

Item 3932 (Conservation of the architectural heritage), created by Parliament in 1980, was without appropriations under the provisional twelfths arrangements. However, all the funds were committed towards the end of the financial year. These appropriations have been automatically carried over to 1981.

It was not possible to use the appropriations originally intended for the European Foundation (0,5 m EUA) because no political decision was taken. They were therefore included in the transfer for the supplementary measures to assist the United Kingdom.

TITLE 4 - REPAYMENTS AND AID TO MEMBER STATES AND MISCELLANEOUS

CHAPTER 40 - FLAT-RATE REPAYMENTS TO THE MEMBER STATES OF COSTS INCURRED IN COLLECTING OWN RESOURCES

The total appropriations of 802,45 m EUA for 1980 were committed. The payments made - 736,20 m EUA - correspond to eleven months of repayments; repayments in respect of own resources collected in December 1980 will be charged to appropriations automatically carried over from 1980 to 1981, with the exception of 1,8 m EUA which will have to be charged to the appropriations for 1981. The reason for the shortfall in 1980 is that 12,5 m EUA was charged to 1980 appropriations in respect of repayments still due for 1979, the appropriations for that year being insufficient. In its Preliminary Draft Supplementary and Amending Budget No 1 for 1980, the Commission proposed a 13,3 m EUA increase in appropriations to cover repayments of costs incurred in collecting own resources in view of the fact that own resources estimates for 1980 were raised and a 12,5 m EUA increase to cover repayments in respect of 1979, which had outstripped the 1979 appropriations. Neither arm of the budgetary authority endorsed the second proposal.

CHAPTER 42 - COMMUNITY LOANS

Within the maximum of US \$3.000 million set by Council Regulation No 397/75 of 17 February 1975 (1), the Community raised a number of loans in 1976 and 1977 for the purpose of helping Member States to overcome their balance of payment difficulties. Pursuant to Council Decision 76/322/EEC of 15 March 1976 (2) the Community on-lent the funds, on the same terms as the loans it had raised, to Italy and Ireland. CHAPTER 43 - LOANS FOR THE PROMOTION OF INVESTMENT IN THE COMMUNITY (THE NEW COMMUNITY INSTRUMENT)

Within the maximum of 1.000 m EUA set by the Council Decision of 16 October 1978 (1), the Commission is authorized to raise loans to finance investment projects of benefit to the Community in the energy and industrial conversion and infrastructure sectors.

Summary of utilization

Commitments

Commitments for 1980 were approved by the Commission in two sets, on 13 May and 15 October. They involved 1.020,66 m EUA, i.e. virtually all (99,9%) of the amount available for the Social Fund in 1980. As mentioned in the previous report, this rapid and complete utilization was made possible by the new rules, which began to apply in 1980 and which require applications for assistance from the Fund to reach the Commission two months before the end of the half-year preceding that during which the relevant operations will begin.

The 49,15 m EUA remaining from 1979 and a further 63 m EUA which was released in 1980 and available for use produced a total of 112 m EUA to be added to the 909,5 m EUA entered for the financial year. Commitment appropriations available for 1980 therefore totalled 1.021,65 m EUA.

Payments

At the end of November the Commission found that it was short of some 100 m EUA to meet payments to be made before the end of the year. It accordingly requested this sum in Supplementary Budget No 2/80, which was primarily intended for emergency aid to Italy. In the course of the budgetary procedure this amount was reduced to 60 m EUA by the Council and raised to 326,4 m EUA by Parliament, the latter figure being finally adopted in Supplementary Budget No 2/80. As it had estimated the Commission was able to make payments of only 130,6 m EUA, the remaining 196 m EUA having been carried over to 1981.

Payments therefore totalled 736,92 m EUA, or almost 80% of the total available in 1980, including Supplementary Budget No 2/80. This figure is over 140 m EUA more than in 1979.

The total appropriations available break down as follows:

The appropriations for the year and the carryovers from 1979 were completely used up. As indicated above, 130,60 m EUA was used from the appropriations of Supplementary Budget No 2/80.

Remarks

Because the necessary basic rules were not adopted, the appropriations of Article 512 (Consequences of industrial conversion) could not be used in 1980 and were transferred and spent elsewhere in Chapter 51.

All the appropriations for Article 510 (Measures to improve the employment situation in certain regions) and Article 511 (Measures for handicapped persons) - both of which had been amended by Parliament - were used up.

Summary of utilization

1. Commitments

(a) Quota section (Chapter 55)

Nearly all the commitments available were used (97,3% of 1.169,6 m EUA). The 32 m EUA unused - certain Member States not having taken up their full quota - have been carried over.

(b) Non-quota section (Chapter 56)

The Council Regulations on the five specific measures proposed by the Commission in October 1979 were formally adopted on 7 October 1980. No funds could be committed in 1980 since the programmes which have to be submitted in accordance with the conditions laid down in the Regulations were not ready. The initial work on implementing these measures will be possible in 1981. The Commission requested and obtained the transfer to Chapter 55 of the remaining appropriation from 1979 so that it would not lapse. As in 1979, it was agreed that a return transfer would be made as soon as it was needed by Chapter 56. The appropriations available in 1981 will therefore amount to 135,25 m ECU.

Payments

(a) Quota section (Chapter 55)

Of the 742 m EUA available, 726,7 m EUA (99,36%) was paid, as against 513,1 m EUA in 1979. As a result of this much improved performance the appropriations available were almost entirely used up (a sum of 4,7 m EUA has been carried over).

(b) Non-quota section (Chapter 56)

Since there had been no commitments, no payments could be made in 1980. Here again, the Commission was prompt to request and obtain a transfer to Chapter 55 of the 16 m EUA carried over from 1979, so that it would not lapse.

The maximum amount of these subsidies, for which only Ireland and Italy are eligible as the least prosperous of the Community countries participating in the EMS, is 1.000 m EUA for a period of five years. The total amount for 1979, 200 m EUA (4), was committed; 160.164.757 EUA has been paid.

Article 571 - Financial compensation to the United Kingdom

Under the same legal provisions as those governing Article 570, financial compensation is paid to a Member State which, if it does not actually participate fully in the European Monetary System, need not bear the burden of implementing the system. Since utilization of these appropriations is tied to the spending of the Article 570 appropriations, the total amount (45.373.000 EUA) was committed, of which 24.835.760 EUA was paid. Payment of this compensation depends upon the completion of the formalities concerning the interest-rate subsidies granted under the EMS.

Summary of utilization

Following the deliberations of the European Council of 30 May and on a proposal from the Commission, the Council, on 27 October 1980, adopted Regulation (EEC) No 2744/80 instituting supplementary measures to assist the United Kingdom (1), and on 6 November 1980 authorized the Commission to pay the United Kingdom, in accordance with Article 5 of that Regulation, advances up to a maximum of 200 m EUA in 1980.

Supplementary Budget No 1/80, adopted on 20 November, provided Chapter 58 with an appropriation of 119,7 m EUA for the purpose.

The Commission was also authorized to transfer to Chapter 58 appropriations from other budget headings, for a total sum to be determined according to what was available at the end of the year (open transfer).

This transfer amounted to 73,8 m EUA. The appropriation available in Chapter 58 then stood at 193,5 m EUA. Two decisions implementing the measures had been taken at 31 December 1980. The sum was entirely committed and 90% of it has been paid, in accordance with Article 5(3) of Regulation 2744/80 (2).

Since the first two operations were for disasters which occurred in 1979 the budgetary authority authorized the non-automatic carryover of 1,2 m EUA, the equivalent of the aid granted in these two cases.

(b) Appropriations for 1980

For the third operation of the year (the hurricane in Réunion) the Commission obtained additional twelfths for this Chapter: two for commitments (833.200 EUA) and four for payments (1.666.400 EUA).

Following the earthquake in Italy on 23 November, the Commission granted aid of 1,5 m EUA on 27 November. This was the balance still unused in that Chapter, less 200.000 EUA kept in reserve in the event of another disaster. Since no such disaster occurred, this amount will lapse at the end of the financial year.

In view of the extensive damage caused by the earthquake, on 4 December the Commission presented Preliminary Draft Supplementary Budget No 2 for 1980, which included a further appropriation of 40 m EUA under Chapter 59 to aid the stricken population.

The Supplementary Budget was adopted on 23 December. The appropriation was committed before the end of the year and has thus been automatically carried over to 1981. It will be paid as soon as the consultations between the Commission and the Italian authorities on its use have been completed.

TITLES 6 and 7 - EUROPEAN ACRICULTURAL CUIDANCE AND CUARANTEE FUND - CUARANTEE SECTION

Preliminary remark

Since Article 98 of the Financial Regulation provides that the accounts are not closed until 31 March of the following financial year, the situation at 31 December 1980 as revealed by the accounts alone — overall commitments and final entries — is not a sufficiently comprehensive view of the status of appropriations at that date.

The following comments are accordingly based on the latest information available to the Commission, in order to give as complete a view as possible of budgetary implementation by the EAGGF Guaranteee Section.

This information consists of:

- (a) implementation for the first ten months of 1980 as recorded in the statements of the paying agencies;
- (b) estimates of expenditure for November and December made by the <u>Member States</u>.

This table confirms that spending has slowed down, as was already noted in the report on the financial situation at 30 September 1980. The picture is as follows:

- with regard to advances: on 31 December appropriations available amounted to 31 m EUA. It should be borne in mind that the December figure of 927 m EUA is made up of a normal advance of 849 m EUA, special advances (1) of 65 m EUA for Italy, Germany, France, Luxembourg and the United Kingdom and direct payments totalling 13 m EUA mainly for certain parties who had obtained favourable judgments from the Court of Justice;
- with regard to payments: the latest information available showed a provisional volume of expenditure for December of 1.070 m EUA, bringing the total for 1980 to 11.320 m EUA and leaving 187 m EUA over (2). If that turns out to be the correct figure, the average monthly expenditure will be 943 m EUA.

II. Utilization by sector

(a) Authorized appropriations

Transfers totalling 317 m EUA were necessary within the EAGGF Guarantee Section to cover shortfalls in appropriations in some chapters:

The chapters involved were:

CHAPTER 60 - CEREALS (+ 30 m EUA)

The good harvest in 1980 resulted in far more exports than expected. But firm world prices in the second half of the year together with tight management of the market by the Commission did much to cushion the impact.

CHAPTER 61 - RICE (+ 15 m EUA)

The reason for the shortfall in appropriations was that exports to non-member countries and supplies to the French department of Réunion in the form of aid exceeded estimates.

CHAPTER 65 - BEEF AND VEAL (+ 200 m EUA)

Consumption fell while production increased, leaving the Community in surplus for the first time. As a result more had to be exported than had been estimated in the budget and greater use had to be made of the various intervention measures.

CHAPTER 66 - PIGMEAT (+ 7 m EUA)

The sluggishness of the internal market made it necessary to resort to private storage from August onwards.

CHAPTER 68 - FRUIT AND VEGETABLES (+ 40 m EUA)

Processed products qualifying for aid, notably tomatoes, were about 10% above estimates.

Production was slightly higher than forecast.

CHAPTER 78 - MCA (1) (+ 15 m EUA)

Expenditure was higher than estimated because of the large volume of exports to non-member countries, particularly of beef and veal and cereals.

The appropriations were drawn from the following chapters where funds were available:

CHAPTER 63 - OILS AND FATS (- 100 m EUA)

It had been assumed that payments would speed up as advances were paid to clive oil producers and the backlog of payments due for previous years was worked off. This hardly materialized.

Moreover, some savings were made on consumption aid because less oil went through the market and a sum of 22 m EUA that had been entered as expenditure in 1979 was recovered in 1980.

CHAPTER 64 - SUGAR (- 100 m EUA)

Exports have been subject to levy since mid-May 1980; this produced substantial savings on export refunds.

CHAPTER 69 - WINE (- 47 m EUA)

Voluntary distillation proceeded more slowly than forecast.

CHAPTER 73 - OTHER COM (2) - Article 734 - Dehydrated fodder (- 25 m EUA)

These savings had appeared possible because world prices were higher than forecast and the quantities eligible for aid had fallen. But the latest estimates would indicate that savings will be less than expected.

(b) Implementation at 31 December 1980

The table below shows, for each sector, expenditure from 1 January to 30 November, Member States' estimates for December, total expenditure and estimates and percentage utilization of appropriations at 31 December. It also shows that on the whole the transfers produced better utilization, the only exceptions being:

- beef and veal, where the market appears to be even more depressed than expected;
- the other common market organizations, where the introduction of the common sheepmeat market on 20 October entailed substantial expenditure;
- the fisheries Chapter, where withdrawal and buying-in operations exceeded estimates.

But it is quite likely that the Commission, acting under Article 101 of the Financial Regulation, will propose to the Council before the limit date of 1 March 1981 a fresh series of transfers based on the final figures for 1980.

Commitments in 1980 amounted to 578,7 m EUA out of the 620,9 m EUA available, giving a rate of utilization of some 93% (1979: 70,5%).

Payments were 591,4 m EUA out of the 950,5 m EUA available, a rate of about 62% (1979: 35%).

Total commitments existing in 1980 amounted to 1.249,1 m EUA. Of this sum, 591,4 m EUA was paid, and 657,7 m EUA (1979: 900,3 m EUA) remains to be cleared (of which 349,8 m EUA out of new payment appropriations to be entered in future budgets).

In comparison with the situation at 30 September 1980, the utilization of the 1980 appropriations more than quadrupled, both for commitments and for payments. At the same time, the rate of utilization of appropriations remaining or carried over practically doubled. Three quarters of all commitments and 60% of all payments were therefore made in the last quarter (even as late as December 1980); this is because of the special features of the implementation of this category of appropriations.

The utilization of commitment appropriations and payment appropriations (differentiated appropriations) is shown in Tables A and B below. These also reveal that large adjustments were made to initial appropriations in 1980.

These adjustments involved a total of 95,13 m EUA (1) in commitment appropriations and 100,92 m EUA in payment appropriations. They were essential for a satisfactory overall utilization of appropriations. Utilization could have been even better if the budgetary authority had approved certain other transfers from Chapter 100.

This last table highlights four essential aspects of implementation in 1980:

- (1) Overall utilization of the differentiated appropriations available in 1980 for the agricultural structures policy was very good both in commitments (93%) and in payments (89%).
- (2) Rates of utilization for individual chapters were equally good, except for Chapter 80, where payments were somewhat slow.
- (3) The improvement in implementation was more marked in 1980 than in 1979: there was a 31% increase in the utilization of commitment appropriations (up from 71% to 93%) and an 85% increase for payment appropriations (up from 48% to 89%).
- (4) Very few budget headings had a utilization rate below 85%; four of these headings (8012, 803, 8321 and 8322) concern new measures on which Council decisions were only taken in 1980 and three (813, 814 and 827) measures on which the Council failed to take decisions in 1980.

This good overall performance was the result of a number of major improvements made in 1980: to begin with, in the Member States there was more extensive implementation of the measures proposed for Community financing and the transmission of requests for payment was speeded up somewhat; second, in the administration of appropriations a system of advances concerning several new measures was introduced and the instalments paid in respect of several old measures were raised from 75% to 100%; finally, in the budget estimates, the allowance to be made for appropriations remaining and carried over from 1979 to 1980 was assessed with greater accuracy.

Despite these improvements, there was no preventing appropriations under certain headings remaining unused. The most marked cases of under-utilization were Item 8013 (6 m EUA), Articles 802 (10 m EUA) and 803 (4,5 m EUA) in respect of commitment appropriations and Articles 800 (18,4 m EUA), 802 (15,7 m EUA) and 803 (3,4 m EUA) in respect of payment appropriations.

It should be borne in mind, however, that in certain cases appropriations were not transferred from Chapter 100 to Title 8 where they should have been (10,8 m EUA in commitment appropriations and 4,6 m EUA in payment appropriations), because no progress was made in establishing the legal bases. If allowance is made for these appropriations, the level of utilization for Chapters 80 to 83 is even more satisfactory.

The reasons for the under-utilization in the headings marked with a cross (+) were as follows:

CHAPTER 80 - PROJECTS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF AGRICULTURAL STRUCTURES

This Chapter concerns only project-type measures, for which the amount of assistance is limited by an annual allocation (closed window), payments being spread over several years and the rate of payments determined by the progress of work.

Article 800 - Projects for the improvement of agricultural structures provided for under Article 13 of Regulation No 17/64/EEC

This is the longest-standing measure in this sector, although since 1 January 1980 no new commitments have been possible on the basis of Regulation No 17/64/EEC. However, the appropriations released under this heading, pursuant to Regulation No 3171/75, may be committed for other projects in accordance with Regulations Nos 355/77 (Article 801) and 1760/78 (Article 802). In 1980 all the appropriations released were committed for projects based on Regulation No 355/77.

The rate of payments was higher than in 1979, many of them (18,5 m EUA) being made out of non-differentiated appropriations released from years prior to 1977 and recommitted between 1977 and 1979. This explains why 18,4 m EUA of the payment appropriations (differentiated appropriations) for 1980 could not be utilized during the year. This amount has been carried over to 1981.

Item 8012 - Marketing and processing of agricultural products in the west of Ireland

After the decision on this new measure was taken on 24 June 1980, 7,7 m EUA (96% of appropriations) was committed by 31 December. However, since the decisions on assistance were taken very late in the year, no payments were possible in 1980 and the untouched appropriation (100.000 EUA) has been carried over to 1981.

Article 802 - Improvements of public services in certain less-favoured areas

In 1980, for the first time, the Community contributed to the financing of infrastructure projects in the less-favoured areas of the south of France, Italy and, in particular, of the Mezzogiorno, providing a total of 29 m EUA. Given the number of eligible projects submitted by these two Member States, the entire commitment appropriation remaining from 1979 to 1980 and part of the new appropriation entered under this heading was utilized. It is planned to finance new projects for a total of 96 m EUA until 1983.

As regards the under-utilization of payment appropriations, it should be noted that, contrary to initial plans and the declared intentions of one Member State (France), no requests for advance payments were made for certain projects. Hence, the entire appropriation entered in the 1980 Budget (2 m EUA) has been carried over to 1981 and 13,7 m EUA, carried over from 1979 to 1980, lapsed on 31 December 1980.

Article 803 - Collective projects for the restructuring of vineyards

This measure, on which the decision was taken on 18 February 1980, provides for a Community contribution to the financing of programme projects to improve basic structures of vineyards producing table wines and quality wines psr.

Since the preparation and approval of such programmes takes time, it was not possible to utilize the appropriations entered in the 1980 Budget by 31 December 1980.

The other headings marked with a cross (+) concern exclusively reimbursement-type measures (open window), for which commitments during the financial year always equal payments.

CHAPTER 81 - GENERAL SOCIO-STRUCTURAL MEASURES

Article 813 - Forestry measures for the improvement of agricultural structures

Article 814 - Special aid for young farmers

CHAPTER 82 - MEASURES TO ASSIST LESS-FAVOURED AREAS

Article 827 - Integrated development programme for south-eastern Belgium

For these three measures, appropriations were entered in Chapter 100 pending Council approval of the basic Regulation. But with no decision being taken in 1980, the appropriations could neither be transferred to the intended headings nor utilized, since no legal basis existed. They lapsed on 31 December 1980.

CHAPTER 83 - STRUCTURAL MEASURES RELATING TO THE COMMON ORGANIZATIONS OF THE MARKET

Item 8301 - Hop producer groups

Item 8302 - Producer groups in the fruit and vegetable sector

In line with requests for reimbursement submitted to the Commission, initial appropriations (carryovers and appropriations for the financial year) had to be increased slightly during the year (see Tables A and B, column 3).

However, with regard to Item 8301 (hops), checks carried out in two Member States revealed an unsatisfactory situation, with the result that most of the aid earmarked for hop producer groups could not be paid in 1980 and has been carried over to 1981 (1,6 m EUA).

As regards Item 8302 (fruit and vegetables), some of the additional information required did not reach the Commission in time, so that an appropriation of 1,97 m EUA could not be used in 1980, 1,8 m EUA of it lapsing on 31 December. For the other reimbursement-type measures the deadline for the receipt of requests for reimbursement is 30 June.

Item 8321 - Premiums for the abandonment of areas under vines and for the renunciation of rights

Item 8322 - Premiums for the cessation of wine production

As with the vineyard restructuring measure (Article 803), the Council decisions on these two measures were taken on 18 February 1980.

Since no requests for reimbursement or payment of advances reached the Commission by 31 December 1980, the appropriations earmarked for the measures under the 1980 Budget either remained unused and were carried over to 1981 (0,7 m EUA) or were transferred (5,8 m EUA).

III. UTILIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS CARRIED OVER

1. Utilization of differentiated appropriations carried over

At 31 December 1980, 98,9% of the appropriation remaining from 1979 (167,3 m EUA) and 91,4% of carryovers (205,9 m EUA (1)) had been used. Given the volume of appropriations remaining and carried over, this was a satisfactory performance and was made possible, in particular, by the adjustments that the budgetary authority made to appropriations in 1980 (transfer No 20/80 of 17 December 1980).

The fact that 2,2 m EUA in commitment appropriations would remain unused (notably under Item 8302) and 17,7 m EUA in payment appropriations (notably under Article 802 and Item 8302) could not be foreseen when the transfer was being prepared, for the reasons given at point II above.

Transfers of appropriations remaining and carryovers (appropriations for commitment: 8 m EUA, appropriations for payment: 20,8 m EUA), were all to Article 820, where they were fully utilized. It should be noted that, under this heading, some of the 1980 appropriations (2,6 m EUA for commitment, or 3% of the total available, and 5 m EUA for payment, or 5% of the total available) could not be used in 1980 and have been carried over to 1981, because it was impossible to obtain the budgetary authority's agreement to an additional transfer of appropriations from Chapter 100, which would have made it possible to satisfy the requests for reimbursement from all the Member States by 31 December 1980.

^{(1) 197,9} m EUA carried forward to 1 January 1980 plus a transfer of 8 m EUA.

2. Utilization of non-differentiated appropriations carried over

It should be borne in mind that, prior to 1977, the EAGGF Guidance Section was endowed with non-differentiated appropriations and that, pursuant to Article 108(3) of the Financial Regulation of 21 December 1977, appropriations committed prior to 1977 which are still awaiting payments are automatically carried over for five years (automatic carryover). After five years, a request to carry over may be made to the Council (non-automatic carryover).

In 1980 only two measures were concerned: individual projects (Article 800) and the salt cod-fishing industry (Item 8300), the latter accounting for only 0,1% of the 435,4 m EUA carried over.

- (a) Utilization of appropriations carried over automatically: 74,2 m EUA was paid out of a total of 267,8 m EUA, i.e. 28% (1979: 22%)
- (b) Utilization of appropriations carried over non-automatically: 53,2 m EUA was paid out of a total of 167,6 m EUA, i.e. 32% (1979: 26%).

IV. COMMITMENTS MADE

In 1980 total commitments (differentiated and non-differentiated appropriations) came to 1.249 m EUA. Of this total 26% was for reimbursement-type measures and was therefore paid in full (323,7 m EUA); the remaining 925,3 m EUA was for "project"-type measures, of which 267,7 m EUA (29%) was paid (1979: 15%).

Commitments still to be settled at 31 December 1980 therefore totalled 657,6 m EUA, a marked improvement on the situation at 31 December 1979 (900,3 m EUA).

CHAPTERS 86 to 89 - FISHERIES POLICY

Commitments in 1980 amounted to 44,3 m EUA out of the 96 m EUA available (about 46%).

Payments made during the year amounted to 32,4 m EUA out of the 73,5 m EUA available (about 44%).

Total commitments existing in 1980 amounted to 48,6 m EUA. Payments against this total were 32,4 m EUA, leaving 16,2 m EUA still to be settled.

2. Utilization of appropriations

The utilization rates (46% for commitment appropriations and 44% for payment appropriations) can be explained by the difficulties encountered in the introduction of the fisheries policy. Spending was particularly slow on structural measures (Chapters 86 and 87). The percentages for Chapter 88 (Common organization of the market in fishery products) do not reflect the final situation at 31 December 1980, since the accounts for the EAGGF Guarantee Section will not be closed until 31 March 1981, in accordance with Article 98 of the Financial Regulation of 21 December 1977. If account is taken of estimated expenditure up to that date, the overall performance in 1980 is found to be better than in 1979.

The utilization of available appropriations is set out, by chapter, in the following tables, which also show headings where the rate of utilization is particularly low.

CHAPTER 86 - COMMON MEASURES TO IMPROVE FISHERIES STRUCTURES

(This Chapter forms part of the EAGGF Guidance Section. See also Tables A and B above)

Article 860 - Common measures to improve the structures of the inshore fishing industry

Appropriations available in 1980 amounted to 35,1 m EUA for commitments and 12 m EUA for payments. The 15,1 m EUA remaining from 1979, earmarked for investment projects in accordance with Council Regulation No 592/79 of 26 March 1979 (1), was committed after the Commission had taken the aid decisions on 31 March 1980. Payments made in 1980 totalled 8,05 m EUA, 67% of the payment appropriation available. In view of the time required to carry out such investment projects, this is a very satisfactory level of utilization.

By Regulation No 1713/80 of 27 June 1980 (2) the Council decided that this measure, which was originally limited to 1978 and 1979, would be extended to 1980 and that expenditure for 1980 would be 20 m EUA. The appropriations (15 m EUA for commitment and 5 m EUA for payment) earmarked for the measure in Chapter 100 of the 1980 Budget were accordingly transferred to Article 860, and the commitment appropriation was increased by a 5 m EUA transfer. These appropriations will remain available in 1981. Under the Council Regulation, the Commission has until 31 March to adopt decisions granting assistance.

CHAPTER 87 - SPECIFIC MEASURES IN THE FISHERIES AND MARINE SECTOR

Article 871 - Financial participation in inspection and surveillance operations in the maritime waters of Denmark and Ireland

In 1979 the Commission adopted the decision necessary for operating this arrangement, the total cost of which was estimated at 56 m EUA. A first instalment of 22 m EUA was committed and paid in 1979. In 1980 the Commission received eligible requests and made payments for only 6,51 m EUA. Large sums were therefore still unused on 31 December 1980 (for commitment 25,74 m EUA, all of which lapses, and for payment 26,34 m EUA, of which 2,34 m EUA lapses). The lapsed appropriations will have to be re-entered in future budgets.

CHAPTER 88 - COMMON ORGANIZATION OF THE MARKET IN FISHERY PRODUCTS (This Chapter forms part of the EAGGF Guarantee Section)

At 31 December 1980, 16,6 m EUA (75%) of the 22 m EUA available had already been utilized. But as this sum actually relates to only eight months of utilization, there will be a shortfall of around 3 m EUA which is to be covered by a transfer before 28 February in accordance with the Financial Regulation.

This over-utilization of appropriations arises from the poor state of fish resources: the lack of quality fish traditionally caught and consumed in the Community is forcing fishermen, in order to stay in work, to catch species for which there is less demand. The result is a glut on the Community markets and, in consequence, an increase in withdrawal expenditure (for products taken into intervention) and refund expenditure (for exports).

- CHAPTER 89 COMMUNITY RESPONSIBILITY FOR CERTAIN FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS
 ARISING FROM AGREEMENTS ON FISHING RIGHTS IN NON-COMMUNITY
 WATERS
- Article 890 Reimbursements due under agreements on fishing in the Adriatic

The appropriations provided for in the 1979 (560.000 EUA of non-automatic carryovers) and 1980 (700.000 EUA entered at Chapter 100) Budgets were intended to reimburse Italy 80% of the financial compensation granted to Yugoslavia in return for rights granted to Italian fishermen to fish in the Yugoslav zone of the Adriatic. However, since no request for reimbursement has reached the Commission despite several reminders, these appropriations remained unutilized and lapsed on 31 December 1980.

TITLE 9 - COOPERATION WITH DEVELOPING COUNTRIES AND OTHER NON-MEMBER COUNTRIES (1)

CHAPTER 92 - FOOD AID

In accordance with Article 102 of the Financial Regulation, which states that "every food aid programme shall as soon as possible be made the subject of a proposal for commitment", the appropriations entered in the budget and covered by an annual programme approved by the Council for each product supplied under the food aid schemes are committed as soon as the programme is approved.

As the 1980 programme was not approved until May, the final stage of implementation, i.e. payment, will cover relatively limited appropriations only, mainly because of the procedures applied both by the Community and by the Member States (time taken to mobilize the products, system of advances similar to that operated by the EAGGF Guarantee Section, minimum period of two months for charging the payments).

As far as the accounts are concerned, commitments are seen to be high, while payments are appreciably lower than the operations actually carried out. Neither commitments nor payments, therefore, give an accurate picture of the situation at any one time in the year and, as in the past, it is considered more appropriate to discuss food aid in terms of the quantities distributed, or remaining to be distributed, under each programme.

Implementation in terms of quantities therefore breaks down as follows (the term "quantities supplied" meaning tonnes of the product which have actually left Community territory):

The following points can be made concerning other forms of food aid:

Article 922 - Food aid in sugar

Emergency food aid including 1.000 tonnes of sugar for countries in the Horn of Africa and neighbouring states was approved by the Council on 22 July 1980. Appropriations of 1.779.000 EUA from the 1980 programme and 350.000 EUA from emergency aid were committed. This was in addition to the 6.086 tonnes supplied to the UNRWA and the 1.000 tonnes supplied to Afghan refugees.

Article 923 - Food aid (other commodities)

An appropriation of 3.900.000 EUA was entered, by transfer, to finance the emergency programme for Nicaragua approved by the Council on 6 May 1980 (purchase of 7.500 tonnes of red beans and 2.800 tonnes of colza oil). A further 400.000 EUA was entered by transfer to provide emergency food aid for victims of the El Asnam earthquake; this was used to buy infant food and 450 tonnes of legumes.

Article 926 - Other expenditure

Item 9260 - Exceptional implementing measures

Of the 500.000 EUA entered in the 1980 Budget, 380.000 EUA was committed to assist the implementation of certain food aid operations carried out under difficult conditions (Nicaragua, Zaire, Equatorial Guinea and Kenya).

Item 9261 - Quality control of products supplied as food aid

The 200.000 EUA entered under Chapter 100 of the budget was transferred to this heading. The Commission decided to use only 100.000 EUA and the whole of this sum was committed: 90.200 EUA for quality control of 20.500 tonnes of milk powder supplied to non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and 9.800 EUA for spot checks of samples of products supplied.

CHAPTER 93 - COOPERATION WITH NON-ASSOCIATED DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

Article 932 - Measures to encourage regional or subregional integration between non-associated countries

The Commission intended to use these appropriations in countries in Asia and South America. In the latter case the expected commitments were held up by political events. Utilization rates were 78% for commitments and 52% for payments.

CHAPTER 94 - SPECIFIC MEASURE'S TO COOPERATION WITH DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

Article 941 - Training of nationals of non-associated developing countries

All the appropriations under this Article were committed and 42% were paid. This rate is a satisfactory performance since the measures concerned involve fact-finding visits and scholarships which do not always coincide with the financial year.

Article 942 - Aid for the management of training institutes for nationals of developing countries

As forecast, all the appropriations under this Article were committed and 78% were paid, an entirely satisfactory figure.

Article 948 - Evaluation of the results of Community aid

All the appropriations under this Article were committed. Payments are proceeding at a satisfactory rate given that some of the studies are of fairly long duration.

- CHAPTER 95 EXCEPTIONAL MEASURES TO ASSIST DEVELOPING COUNTRIES AND OTHER NON-MEMBER COUNTRIES
- Article 950 Aid to disaster victim in developing and other non-member countries

The 43 m EUA originally entered under this Article was increased by 20 m EUA for aid to Kampuchea. Almost all the appropriations were committed and payments totalled over 90%, a normal figure for this type of emergency aid.

CHAPTER 96 - COOPERATION WITH NON-MEMBER COUNTRIES

Article 960 - Financial cooperation with Portugal

Utilization in both commitments and payments was 72%, appreciably better than in 1979.

Article 967 - Cooperation with the Arab countries at regional level

The appropriations entered under this heading were not used because of the lack of political progress towards the original objectives. They were included in the open transfer.

CHAPTER 93 - COOPERATION WITH NON-ASSOCIATED DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

Article 930 - Financial and technical cooperation with non-associated developing countries

The Commission decided to commit the 1980 appropriations on its own responsibility. Of the 176 m EUA available under this heading, 75% (133 m EUA) had been committed by 31 December 1980 and all the appropriations remaining from 1979 had been used. The commitment appropriations still remaining relate either to projects which are still being studied or to projects which present political difficulties for certain Member States (projects in Angola and Mozambique).

All the appropriations for payment carried over from 1979 were used. But as the 1980 appropriations were not committed until the end of December 1980, only 3 m EUA (15% of the 22 m EUA entered under this heading) could be paid. Most of the appropriations automatically carried over will be used early in 1981 to finance the cooperation programme with India.

The rate of utilization of all available appropriations for both commitment and payment showed some improvement in 1980 compared with the previous year (1).

Article 931 - Promotion of trade between the Community and non-associated developing countries

As forecast in the report on the financial situation at 30 September 1980, the rate of utilization of available appropriations for commitment under this heading continued to be satisfactory (93%) while that for appropriations for payment showed a marked improvement over the previous financial year (76% compared with 56%).

CHAPTER 94 - SPECIFIC MEASURES FOR COOPERATION WITH DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

Article 945 - Community contribution towards schemes concerning developing countries carried out by non-governmental organizations (NGOs)

The interest generated by this type of cofinancing operation is illustrated by the almost complete utilization of the appropriations under this heading (100% for commitment and 98% for payment).

CHAPTER 96 - COOPERATION WITH NON-MEMBER COUNTRIES

With the implementing regulations for the financial protocols with the Mediterranean countries still not adopted, it continues to be difficult to act rapidly on these cooperation programmes. Since most aid will be for investment projects covering a number of years, only the rate of utilization of appropriations for commitment is significant. In this respect, the rate for Chapter 96 as a whole improved distinctly in 1980 (74% compared with 55% in 1979).

This rate does, however, vary considerably from country to country. While all the appropriations available for Malta were committed and those for Greece proceeded at a very satisfactory rate (94%), problems arose which hampered the utilization of the appropriations provided for Turkey (51%) and left those for Cyprus completely untouched. However, a project in Cyprus is being studied and it is expected that some of the appropriations available can be committed during 1981.

The rate of utilization of the available appropriations for commitment in the Maghreb countries was completely satisfactory, ranging from 95% for Algeria to 99% for Morocco. There was greater variation in the Mashreq countries, however, where rates ranged from 39% for Egypt and 43% for Lebanon to 98% for Jordan. These differences reflect the political and financial problems connected with the projects intended for those countries.

Although the rate of utilization of appropriations for payment was very low, a start was made on payments in respect of those operations for which commitments ought to be completed by the end of October 1981, when the protocols expire.

DURING THE FOURTH QUARTER OF 1980

Impact of tariff changes in the fourth quarter of 1980

The effect of decisions taken in the fourth quarter of 1980 amending or suspending tariff provisions will be to reduce customs duties by an estimated 405 m EUA (as compared with the normal CCT level) and agricultural levies by 63,5 m EUA.

The size of the drop in customs duties is chiefly due to renewal of Regulation (EEC) No 435/80 on the arrangements applicable to agricultural products originating in the ACP and OCT (giving exemption from customs duties for beef and veal, fisheries products, oils and fats, fruit and vegetables and tobacco). The theoretical drop in revenue for 1981 is 285 million EUA, the real impact being 47 million EUA as this scheme was already applied in 1980. This reduction was allowed for in the customs duties estimates entered in the 1981 Budget.

In the end, as earlier concessionary arrangements have been renewed and the losses on two quotas (ferrous chromium and paper) have been curbed, the real loss of customs duties will be only 40,5 m EUA.

The loss in agricultural levies is 24,8 m EUA.

The tables below give a breakdown of tariff changes by legal basis and their financial implication for each period of application.

The table shows an aggregate loss of customs duties for the whole period of 608,3 m EUA as compared with full application of the CCT, and a net reduction in agricultural levies of 233,7 m EUA. When account is taken of the fact that some earlier arrangements are being renewed, the real net loss is 76,9 m EUA for customs duties and 11,5 m EUA for levies.
