First results of the demographic data collection for 2000 in Europe

Joint Council of Europe/Eurostat demographic data collection

The objective of this publication is to provide some basic demographic information for 2000. However, given the timetable (rapid questionnaire sent out in May 2001 with a return date of June), not all countries could provide all the information while some figures are provisional or estimates. Additional and/or more definitive information will be published in the annual reports of the Council of Europe ("Recent demographic developments in Europe 2001") and Eurostat ("Demographic Statistics 2001").

Main demographic trends for 2000

The population of the European Union increased by 0.3 per cent in 2000, the same increase as in 1999. About two-thirds of the total increase of just over 1 million was due to net inward migration (680 thousand) and one third to natural increase (372 thousand). While all the countries of the European Union saw population growth in 2000, Germany, Italy, Greece and Sweden, as in 1999, witnessed a small natural decrease (more deaths than births). The largest growth rates occurred in Luxembourg (1.3 per cent) and Ireland (1.1 per cent). In contrast, many countries in Central and Eastern Europe again saw declines in population size. The Ukraine, Latvia, the Russian Federation and Bulgaria all saw decreases of over 0.5 per cent (see Tables 1 and 2).

A significant feature of 2000 was the increase in the total fertility rate for the EU as a whole, from 1.45 in 1999 to 1.53 in 2000, the highest figure for ten years. Nine of the fifteen countries witnessed an increase, the largest change being seen in France, from 1.77 in 1999 to 1.89 in 2000. The United Kingdom (1.64) and Germany (1.34) were the only countries where the rate fell, with the lowest rates being seen in Spain (1.22), Italy (1.25) and Greece (1.30). The lowest rates observed elsewhere were 1.10 in Georgia, 1.14 in the Czech Republic and 1.17 in the Russian Federation; the highest figure was again seen in Turkey at 2.50.

Table 4 shows the dramatic decline in infant mortality. Within the EU, the rate varied from 6.1 in Greece to 3.0 in Sweden. The rate of decline has been most dramatic in Southern Europe countries. In Portugal there has been a four-fold decrease over the last 20 years. In Central and Eastern Europe the highest rates occurred in Romania (18.6), Moldova (18.4) and the Russian Federation (17.1 for 1999). The rate for the USA was 6.8, higher than any European Union country. The effect of decreasing mortality rates has been to increase longevity. The EU average expectation of life at birth (based on 2000 mortality rates) is nearly 75 years for a man and 81.2 years for a woman, 4.5 and 4.0 years higher respectively than twenty years ago. The highest averages for men were observed in Sweden (77.4) and Italy (76.2) and for women in Spain, France and Italy (all around 82.6/82.7). These averages compare with 74.2 and 79.7 for men and women respectively in the USA. The highest averages for other Council of Europe Member States were found in Iceland, Switzerland, San Marino and Norway. The lowest average for men was seen in Russia at less than 60 years, some 2 years below the average for India (see Table 4 for more detail).

There were 1.9 million marriages in the European Union in 2000 compared to 2.2 million in 1980. The corresponding figures for divorce were 0.7 million and 0.5 million respectively. Thus while the popularity of marriage has diminished somewhat, the incidence of divorce has increased and this is reflected in the crude rates shown in Table 5.



Figure 1: World population, 2001




Figure 2: Share of the world's population increase, 2000





Figure 3: Components of population change, 2000 (per 1000 population)



GLOSSARY

Natural increase: the difference between the number of live births and the number of deaths.

Net migration: the difference between the number of immigrants and the number of emigrants. In this publication, it is calculated by taking the difference between total population increase and natural increase.

Crude rate: the ratio of the number of events to the mean population in a given year.

Total fertility rate: the average number of children that would be born alive to a woman during her lifetime if current age specific fertility rates were to continue.

Infant mortality rate: the ratio of deaths of children under one year of age to the live births in a given year.

Life expectancy at birth: the average number of years a person would live if current age specific mortality rates were to continue.

Council of Europe Member States: all the European Union countries, Andorra (AND), Albania (ALB), Armenia (ARM), Azerbaijan (AZE), Bulgaria (BGR), Croatia (HRV), Cyprus (CYP), Czech Republic (CZE), Estonia (EST), Georgia (GEO), Hungary (HUN), Iceland (ISL), Latvia (LVA), Liechtenstein (LIE), Lithuania (LTU), Malta (MLT), Moldova (MDA), Norway (NOR), Poland (POL), Romania (ROM), Russian Federation (RUS), San Marino (SMR), Slovak Republic (SVK), Slovenia (SVN), Switzerland (CHE), the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (MKD), Turkey (TUR), Ukraine (UKR).

Council of Europe non-Member States with observer status: Belarus (BLR), Bosnia and Herzegovina (BIH), the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (YUG).

More developed countries: all countries in Europe (including European members of the CIS-Commonwealth Independent States), Australia, Canada, Japan, New Zealand, Turkey, the United States of America.

Less developed countries: all countries excluding more developed countries
